

REAGAN INSTITUTE POLL: BIPARTISAN SUPPORT FOR AIDING UKRAINE AND STANDING UP TO CHINA ENDURES, AMERICANS OPPOSE CUTTING DEFENSE

WASHINGTON, DC - The Ronald Reagan Presidential Foundation and Institute today released the results of the Reagan Institute Summer Survey, a national public opinion poll on foreign policy and national security issues. The survey, which asked questions of 1,254 people, found Americans have clear, strong, and enduring views on continued U.S. leadership and engagement with the world, from deterring China and supporting Ukraine to increasing defense spending. The survey also examines partisan perceptions of international engagement and border security and immigration issues.

Key takeaways include:

- **Ukraine:** Despite increased partisan rhetoric, support for aid to Ukraine has not wavered since our November 2022 survey. A majority of Americans support sending U.S. military aid to Ukraine, and **three-quarters say that it is important to the United States that Ukraine wins the war.**
- **Defense Spending**: Nearly 60% of Americans, including 70% of Republicans, oppose cutting military spending to reduce the federal budget deficit.
- China: A majority of Americans support measures to deter Chinese aggression against Taiwan, and bipartisan majorities would support a trade deal designed to counter China.
- Engagement vs. Isolationism: Americans' approach to balancing domestic concerns with international engagement remains complex, but maintaining a strong military (85% support), promoting international trade (76%), and defending human rights abroad (74%) all command robust majority support.
- **TikTok:** Opinion is split on banning TikTok. While Republicans are more likely to support a ban than Democrats, **the greatest disparity in opinion occurs across age cohorts**.

"Americans have core principles that have remained consistent over time, specifically in their enduring support for a strong military, defending Ukraine against Russian aggression, and deterring China," said the Director of the Ronald Reagan Institute Roger Zakheim. "Our survey shows the

American people want the United States to demonstrate leadership in the world in line with President Reagan's principle of 'peace through strength.'"
