
About the Survey



Mode	Combined telephone (n=494) and online panel (n=760) survey. Telephone interviews conducted by trained professionals calling landlines (49%) and cellphones (51%).
Sample	1,254 US adults
Dates	May 30 – June 6, 2023
Weights	Slight weights were applied to ensure the sample accurately reflects the demographic profile of the US population.
Margin of Error	$\pm 2.8\%$ at the 95% confidence level for the entire sample, $\pm 3.9\%$ for split-sampled questions. The margin of error for subgroups is higher.



Q2. Would you say things in the United States today are:


Broad support for increased domestic and military spending.



Q3-10. Do you favor or oppose increasing government spending in each of the following areas?


Support for increasing military spending remains high.

Majorities oppose cuts to military, border security, infrastructure and entitlements to reduce deficit.




Q11-16. In order to reduce the federal budget deficit, would you favor or oppose cutting spending on each of the following?




Bipartisan agreement that the US should engage and lead on world issues.




Q32. To what extent do you think the US should provide international leadership and engage with the world's issues? 0=US should not engage and let others lead, 10=US should engage and take a leadership role


Partisans see the other side as not engaged, and their own side more engaged.


Most think a strong US military is essential for peace; less agreement on engagement versus withdrawal.






Q17-20. Do you agree or disagree with each of the following statements about US leadership and engagement in international events?

Views of foreign policy philosophy, by party ID.



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


Top focus for foreign policy: protecting jobs, fighting terror.










Mixed views on effect of foreign trade agreements.




Trade agreements <u>help</u> the US.

Trade agreements <u>hurt</u> the US.


American workers and companies have difficulty competing with countries that have looser labor laws and environmental standards, so jobs get shipped offshore and average Americans lose out.

Majority would support a trade agreement designed to counter China.







Top security threats from illegal immigration: drugs and cartel operations.



Strong support for increasing skilled immigration, but framing as a national security need does not help.










No consensus on who is winning the war in Ukraine.




Q48. Who do you think is currently winning the war between Russia and Ukraine?

Strong majority support for military aid to Ukraine.



Independents, Trump primary voters only groups without majority support for military aid to Ukraine.






Q50. Overall, do you support or oppose sending US military aid to Ukraine?

Unmet needs at home is the top reason to oppose aid to Ukraine.





Auditing measures would not do much to allay aid opponents' doubts.






Top reasons to support military aid: standing up to Russian aggression, protecting freedom.

Half think aid to Ukraine has been worth cost; two-thirds think the same after learning more.






Q56. Do you think our European allies are doing their fair share in response to the war in Ukraine, or should they be doing more?


Most groups see countering Chinese military power as a higher priority than countering Chinese economic power.





Q21 AND 26. Next, should each of the following be a major focus of US foreign policy efforts, a minor focus, or not really a focus at all?


Slight decrease in support for measures to deter Chinese invasion of Taiwan, driven by Democrats.

Wide majority think recent meetings with Taiwanese leadership were the right thing to do.



Views split on banning TikTok.





Preventing nuclear acquisition major focus, by subgroups.




Preventing countries that do not have nuclear weapons from acquiring them

Majorities support nonmilitary responses to Iranian nuclear development; little interest in doing nothing.






Do you support each of the following as a response?


Promoting freedom and democracy in authoritarian countries
